The Indigenous Sport Enhancement Program is committed to raising the performance level of Indigenous athletes in sport, and increasing the capacity of Indigenous coaches, officials and volunteers. The program is aimed at developing and preparing athletes for major competitions and multi-sport games, with a focus on the North American Indigenous Games. It is also designed to support year-round high-intensity individual and sport-specific training programs devoted to skill and fitness development and competition-specific training. The Advanced Coaching Diploma (ACD) is the most extensive multisport training program offered by the NCCP in Canada. ACD coaches are recognized as being among the most qualified coaches and leaders of Canadian athletes and sport programs competing provincially, nationally, and internationally. The Diploma consists of four core themes: Coaching Leadership, Coaching Effectiveness, Performance Planning, and Training and Competition Readiness. KidSport is a children's charity designed to assist children of families facing financial barriers to participate in community sport programs So ALL Kids Can Play! These grants were created to provide financial assistance for the purchase of Adaptive Sport equipment, support club and program development and provide athlete assistance to help increase participation in sport at all levels and for all abilities. These programs are made possible through financial contributions from the Sask Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture & Recreation and are administered through Sask Sport. Active and Affiliate members of Sask Sport are eligible to apply. In addition, local or community clubs/ organizations can apply with the endorsement of an Active/ Affiliate member of Sask Sport.
